Adult Behavioral Health Services

The goal is to preserve and promote the well-being of DuPage County residents who have mental illness and/or substance use issues.

Better Birth Outcomes (Great Start)

Provides prenatal health education, linkage and coordination of care with primary and specialty medical care and other social services, and overall care coordination to pregnant women with risk factors to ensure a healthy pregnancy and baby.

Birth Certificates

Certified copies of birth certificates for persons born in DuPage County are available for a fee.

Childcare Environmental Health Program

Monitors health and safety in childcare centers and group homes and responds to public complaints.

Communicable Disease Control and Prevention

Surveillance and investigation of communicable diseases.

Community Environmental Health Program

Investigate complaints of health hazards and general nuisances in the community.

Crisis Services (630) 627-1700 & 988

Crisis Services responds to mental health emergencies for adults, children, and adolescents on a 24-hour basis, 365 days a year. Services are provided in person and by phone to residents with urgent behavioral or mental health issues such as suicidal thoughts, homicidal threats and symptoms of serious mental illnesses that require immediate intervention.

Death Certificates

Certified copies of death certificates for deaths in DuPage County are available for a fee.

Dental Health Program

Provides access to dental services, low-cost treatment options, referrals and oral health education for children and adults. These services are offered at two clinic locations and at DuPage County schools through the Dental Sealant Program and the Smile Squad mobile dental clinic.

Environmental Health Services Education

Community health promotion and education involving environmental health issues.

Family Case Management

Provides advocacy, coordination of medical, dental, and social services to eligible pregnant women and infants. Offers health education, assessments, and screenings as well as referrals to area resources such as health care providers, transportation, nutrition services, and mental health services.

Food Protection Program

Monitors food protection and sanitary conditions in DuPage County food establishments. Regulates the construction and remodeling for food facilities including temporary food and mobile vendors. Responds to public complaints regarding food establishments.

Forensic Behavioral Health

Provides assessment and treatment for those who have mental health and/or substance use treatment needs, who are also involved in the criminal justice system.

Health Promotions

Provides free health education programs for public and private schools and other specialty groups in the community.

Health Works of Illinois

Provides comprehensive medical case management services for children in the custody of DCFS. Maintains a network of healthcare providers for services to children in foster care, including initial health screenings, comprehensive health examinations, primary care physicians and specialty care physicians. HealthWorks staff, foster parents and caseworkers work closely together to ensure that foster children receive appropriate and timely medical care.

Healthy Families DuPage

Provides parenting support, child development information, and connection to community resources to families expecting their first baby or with a child under 3 months. Healthy Families DuPage is a home visiting program designed to promote positive parenting and build upon family strengths.

Health Insurance and Benefit Resources

If you are uninsured or underinsured and live in DuPage County, a community health worker will provide information and enrollment assistance for Medicaid, SNAP, All Kids, Marketplace, and Access DuPage.





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High Risk Infant Follow-Up / Adverse Pregnancy Outcomes Reporting System

Infants who are born with birth defects and other adverse outcomes are eligible for follow-up services upon the infant's discharge from the hospital. These services include a series of home visits provided by a public health nurse, information about the infant's health condition(s), infant health assessments, and referrals to other services as needed.

Immunizations

Provides childhood immunizations for a fee.

Private Water Supply and Sewage Disposal

Regulates the construction, installation, repair and the proper use of private water supplies and sewage disposal systems (septic systems).

Pools, Spas, Tanning, Body Art

Regulates the operation of spas, tanning facilities and body art facilities.

Sexually Transmitted Disease Services

Provides education, counseling, testing, diagnosis, focused physical exams, and treatment, including HIV testing and pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP).

School Health Services

Consultation available to public and private schools, including childcare centers and colleges.

Tobacco Prevention and Control

Linkage to services and training on issues of tobacco prevention control and cessation.

Tuberculosis Services

Provides TB testing, diagnosis, and treatment, as well as community education, surveillance, contact investigations, and TB clearance for work and immigration.

Vision and Hearing Screening

For children 3 – 18 years of age in the school setting.

Water Testing

Environmental laboratory for testing water.

West Nile virus Surveillance

Traps and tests mosquitoes and provides dead bird monitoring for West Nile virus. Results reported on website.

Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Services

Provides nutrition education, nutritious supplemental foods, breastfeeding support, and healthcare referrals to eligible women who are pregnant or post-partum, infants, and children up to age 5.

Youth & Family Behavioral Health Services

The goal of the Youth & Family Services program is to strengthen the functioning of families by assisting a child or adolescent with behavioral health problems.
